

SkillsUSA is a national nonprofit organization serving teachers, high school and college students who are preparing for careers in trade, technical and skilled service occupations, including health occupations. SHS Building Trades and Cosmetology are very active with SkillsUSA preparing our students for these types of jobs and skills. Building Trades, Cosmetology and Early Childhood Education, all taught in the Career and Technical Center, had members from SkillsUSA attend the District Leadership Competition on Saturday, February 8, 2014. News from each of the departments follows:

**BUILDING TRADES** - Under the leadership of Mr. Tommie Hagans, the Building Trades Department will be competing in several District I competitions during the month of February. On February 6, students traveled to the Virginia Beach Technical and Career Center to compete in the Masonry Competition.
