RE: Litter Control Council activities, Spring 2011

The Southampton Litter Control Council's efforts are beginning to take shape. The Sheriff's Department has identified a number of areas along roadways in the county where littering is significantly more prevalent. The council has purchased signs which can be moved from site to site as reminders of the dangers of illegal dumping and what it can cost the citizens of the county. In addition cameras will be purchased and then donated to the sheriff's office to be used at illegal dump sites, once a complaint has been received by the Sheriff's Department. The goal is to let the violators know that they are being watched.

In addition we are moving along with our reorganization to reach into the community to touch groups of all ages to further the cause of recycling and litter control, by developing new committees and refining those in place and we welcome input from the public through suggestion, participation with the council.
