The proposed withdrawal will utilize the Columbia aquifer at a depth between 0 and 65 feet below the land surface at the withdrawal site. An aquifer is a body of rock or layer of sediment in the ground in which ground water is stored and transported. DEQ has made a tentative decision to issue the permit.

This notice is to advise that you may be in violation of §12 VAC 5-590-370 of the Commonwealth of Virginia *Waterworks Regulations*. According to our records, a combined nitrate/nitrite nitrogen sample was required during the calendar year of 2010, and none was collected, analyzed, or reported.

#### **Required Actions**
