

Dear Mr. Johnson:

The Southeastern Public Service Authority would like to express its sincere appreciation for all the support that has been provided by your community during the difficult financial times which the Authority has experienced over the past eighteen months. We have seen the Authority move from the verge of not being able to meet its financial commitments to a position today where we find the Authority in the best financial position it has been since its inception in the mid 1980s.

As you are likely aware, the Authority has completed the sale of the Waste to Energy Facilities to Wheelabrator Portsmouth in late April and the Authority has paid down its debt using all of the \$150 million received from the sale. This puts the Authority owing \$77 million which will be fully paid by January 24, 2018.

Accomplishing this has not been easy for the Authority or the communities. We saw tipping fees increase to \$170 per ton. But through continued reductions in personnel and operational costs within the Authority, the tipping fee was reduced to \$150 per ton beginning July 1 of this year. This is saving the communities upwards of \$5 million throughout this fiscal year alone. Our goal, of course, will continue to be to further reduce the tipping fee when possible.

The Authority has seen its workforce reduced from 411 employees to a current 163. 172 employees went to work for Wheelabrator after the sale of the WTE facilities was finalized and 76 positions were eliminated from the operations and administration workforce. The Authority has terminated the recycling program and will soon be considering offers from the public to purchase the recycling property. Currently the Authority operates only the transfer stations, household hazardous waste and white goods, transportation and maintenance of our trucking and heavy equipment fleet and the regional landfill which is receiving very little waste since all non-processable waste which used to go there now is taken by Wheelabrator to a non-SPSA landfill in Hampton or Waverly. Some further reductions in operations of the system are also very likely. All of this has been accomplished with practically no impact on how the organization has disposed of the communities' and region's waste.

The new SPSA Board of Directors took office on January 1 of this year and will soon be holding its first retreat at the end of this month. Since the SPSA Use and Support
