I wanted to let you know how we are responding to the \$5,000. cut by the County to the Blackwater Regional Library's annual budget. We are all very aware that the County is really in a beleaguered situation, and that you and the Board of Supervisors did your utmost to keep the pain to a minimum.


We realized that further cuts to the Courtland branch were really not possible, so we decided to make the cuts to Bookmobile stops in Southampton County. The part time library assistant assigned to the Bookmobile had just tendered her resignation since her husband had found employment in North Carolina, so we were able to make changes without laying off personnel. We will fill that position with fewer hours, accommodating only the stops remaining. We also tried very hard to make the least critical changes to the schedule that we could, targeting the ones that were less used or were near other stops.

The stops that will be eliminated are Sebrell, Joyner, Capron, Newsoms, and at Hunterdale Elementary. We will keep the stops in Ivor, Sedley, Drewryville, and Boykins. These stops are the most productive and/or the most isolated.

I know that none of us are happy to see library services lost, and my hope is that within a few years we will be able to restore the services lost because of the current economic environment.

Dear Mr. Johnson;

Synagro Central, LLC, a residuals management company, will provide biosolids land application services to various approved sites in your county. As required by §§ 32.1-164.5 and §§ 62.1-44.19:3 of the Code of Virginia (Chapter 459), we are hereby giving you 100 days notice that we will possibly land-apply to any of the sites listed on the enclosed Attachment A from October 10, 2010 to October 10, 2011. The sites utilized will be dependent upon weather conditions, crop rotations, when they last received biosolids and agronomic rate required. Also enclosed is proof of insurance as required.

Biosolids are treated and stabilized wastewater treatment residuals, which are land applied as a viable alternative to commercial fertilizers. Therefore, material is provided to farms based on crop nutrient requirements and is usually supplied one time per year. Sensitive areas, such as houses and streams are buffered from land application activities. These site restrictive buffer zones will be measured and marked with visible flags in the field prior to any land application operations conducted on the farm sites. All operations must comply with any state and federal regulations, and also with sound farm management practices and erosion control measures.

Synagro Central, LLC intends to use material from sources that are approved through the Virginia Department of Health (VDH) for the state of Virginia (see attached list).

Dear Mr. Faison;

There are several items of interest, to the Town Council, that will continue after my tenure as Mayor has ended. I'm sure Preston will continue to follow up for the Council.

We (the Town Council) would appreciate your continued support for the liquid asphalt holding/distribution facility being built outside of Branchville. We know a conditional use permit has been issued but we see new correspondence with the State Fire Marshall. We believe what the State fire Marshall's office has referenced is currently in the building code. Our fire department relies on the facility being built to the current code. The fire department studied the facility location, MSDS and ERG concluding that 60k of stored water on site and what they carry would be sufficient for normal fires. A 5" supply line could be extended across the railroad track for larger fires. The Fire Department asked the Town Council to continue requesting a water line be run under the track and extended down Moore Lane, tying in with the existing line on Old Branchville Road. We respectfully request you continue your effort to get this water line under the track to serve the industrial site. The Town started requesting this when the larger part of the Porter Farm was rezoned M-2 in the latter part of 2000. We also would like to see it included in the Capital Improvement Plan with a high ranking.

We respectfully request you get the Boykins-Branchville and Newsoms water systems connected. This was in the original plan but was removed to cut costs with a promise it would be connected at a later date. We have had 3 major fires in the last several years that have nearly drained the serving system. Two at a lumber facility located between Boykins and Newsoms (Newsoms tank) and one recently in the Town of Boykins proper. Connecting the two would give the Boykins-Branchville system the capacity of the water tank in Newsoms plus what their pumps could produce and the Newsoms system the capacity of the Boykins-Branchville water tank and what our pumps could produce to be used for fire suppression. We think Mayor Edwards request for generators is appropriate as there can be a major fire during a power outage or when we have an extended power outage after a hurricane or some other catastrophic event. We also request you have the county install dry hydrants at all accessible water sources. This could be done, over a period of time, for free as the Commonwealth has a program that pays for them. This

would also be beneficial during power outages and also could lower insurance rates in non-hydrated areas.

We respectfully request the Economic Development, Sites & Buildings Web Page for the Boykins-Branchville Site be redone. Let's call it the Meherrin Valley Site and place it where it is really located; at the intersection of Moore Lane and Old Branchville Road. Hugo Road and Joyner Road (the present and incorrect location) never meet and both are Southwest of Branchville not Boykins.


Have someone contact the CSX System in Jacksonville about putting a water line under the track. It is our understanding that no one, from the County, in an official capacity has contacted their office. They might be receptive and possibly even assist in the endeavor. They are looking for something to replace the freight in/out of IP and this is already a productive site. There have been rate inquiries about inbound TOFC's, bulk liquid farm chemicals also outbound TOFC's, packaged and bulk fertilizer shipments from the Branchville area.

Finally take a real close look at putting the water line under the track. The site is already generating more than enough revenue to pay for it. The proffer deal has been blow; there are already three industries there and no line has be run. Run the water line under the track and let proffers from the next tenants tie in the water system to the one on Old Branchville Road and also connect to the sewer system, which is just down the hill on the site side of the tracks. It would be gravity fed not requiring a pump station.

Southampton County is not the only one trying to attract small industries. We understand Northampton County (NC) is in the process of constructing a natural gas line from Conway to Severn. NC. They are trying to attract the same industries that are looking at the Meherrin Valley Site. Southampton County simply has to do something. Do not put all our resources in the Turner Tract, spread them throughout the County.

We thank you for your assistance in these matters and as I've said I'm sure Preston will be following up with you.


The Town Council takes issue with item # 3 on page 3 of this letter.

Since the original system was installed, the Town Council has complained about the flushing of the fire hydrants. We went as far as assigning Mr. Franklin W. Phelps, Jr. the task of researching the most adequate method to flush hydrants on a dead end or closed system. This information was given to the County Administrator.

Mr. John Jenkins has been the only one since 1988 to flush the system adequately and to have an established flushing schedule. When Mr. Jenkins was no longer flushing the system, it is as before with the same complaints. In response to the complaints, Mayor Arthur Harris was told that the Town's system was flushed on a regular basis. In item #3 on page 3 of the letter, we find that some hydrants are being flushed only when a complaint is made. This is not acceptable.

Because the system is so different now, the Town Council would like for a determination to be made of what is required to adequately flush all hydrants. Also, to be provided with a flushing schedule.
